There has also been an openness to the gifts I have brought in my ministry, the stewardship campaign, which has generated such positive results, the innovation team which is starting important conversations about future ministry opportunities and of course finding my book being studied. Thank you for that.

There is no question that the church is facing challenging times across the Western world and St. Marks is not immune to those trends. If I have a wish for St. Marks it is that once your permanent minister is chosen that you spend significant time and energy focusing on your mission and vision for the years ahead. This is critical work to ensure the long term sustainability of St. Marks and is work that all congregations need to undertake today.

In closing, both Wendy and I want to thank you all so much for your warm welcome and a wonderful year that we have both treasured.

AN INTERVIEW WITH ALAN HALL

WHAT DO YOU VALUE ABOUT ST MARKS?

I really value the relationships that we built together, the trust that was built over the 23 years. We started from a place of trust and it was an awesome and daunting experience. They trusted me enough to let me do some crazy things! We created unique worship that was dramatic and theatrical, we laid it out and everyone made it work. The most significant example of that was the Good Friday when we stripped the

sanctuary and hung 6 huge canvasses depicting the killing of the Donnelly family and they became like the Stations of the Cross. On Easter we had the same pictures present but now they were symbols of bringing new life, we had 150 people standing in the sanctuary, it was chaotic!

WHAT MADE YOUR MINISTRY WORK FOR 23 YEARS?

I would say that there were three distinct phases of my ministry at St Marks. We were very attentive to the changes in the community and had a higher level of intentionality about our ministry. We had a clear sense of who we were as a church, we saw ourselves as a small church

of great depth. Also the church allowed me to grow and gave me the space I needed to do ministry outside of St Marks, which benefited both of us.

WHAT ARE YOUR HOPES FOR ST MARKS?

That they continue to be an authentic and honest and safe place for members and all who arrive. Continue to be aware of the wider community and church, there is a need and responsibility to be active in both.


The Ministry and Personnel team is searching for a Supply Minister, with the hopes to start in early April.
